"The Spiritual Starter Kit" - 2nd What God did.

Hi,

Here's one of the most remarkable aspects of your relationship with God.

You are not in this relationship alone.

This is not one-way communication. It's not merely you worshiping God. He is also very involved.

God pursued you!

I remember the first few days after asking Jesus Christ into my life. I had so many questions:

What is he like? What does he care about?
What does God think about our lives here?
How does he view us? Or me?!

Here's the surprising thing. In the Bible, he answers those kind of questions! And more!

Now that you have a relationship with God, you will find him speaking individually to you as you read the Bible. He reveals himself through it. He will speak directly to your heart.

Don't ask me how he does it. He just does.

Do you have a Bible? If not, you can get one at any neighborhood Christian bookstore, or on Amazon.com.

When you go to buy a Bible, you'll find various translations. The King James Version uses "thee" and "thou" which is a tad slow to read (unless you're someone who speeds through Shakespeare).

If you need to buy a Bible, I'd recommend any of these:

New Living Translation (NLT)
English Standard Version (ESV)
New International Version (NIV)

Ok, let's move ahead to how to read the Bible. There's really nothing tricky about it.

Let's say you read this statement that's in the Bible, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son..."

And I asked you: "How does God feel about people in the world?" I really wouldn't want you to get creative. Or imagine how God might feel or should feel.

When you read the Bible, simply look at what it says.

"For God so loved the world..." That tells you how God feels about people in the world: He loves us.

Makes sense?

Ok, here's a Bible study I think you'll enjoy. It shows how God is in this relationship with you!

Lesson # 5 - The value of other believers

Hi

Have you ever spent time with a marathon runner? (Maybe you're one!) Did you ever know a serious runner who didn't train with other runners?

Rarely happens. Why?

They need the motivation. Accountability. They need someone who expects them to show up at 5:30 in the morning. Someone they can run with, who will challenge their speed and distance.

Guess what? We need others around us who know Jesus. Who want God to influence their lives.

In case you're thinking I'm about to advocate "sign up with X group" - that's not going to happen.

I'm talking about the value of being around ANYONE who believes in Jesus and seeks to follow him.

When I first became a believer, I grew to know God through a variety of things. Let me list those for you, in priority order (that was true in my life, anyway)...

- time with God, reading the Bible and talking to him.

I was always asking God questions. "Could you explain..." "How do you want me to trust you regarding this..." "What about this..." I would write out verses from the Bible, sometimes even write out my prayers. I preferred doing this in chunks of time. So I scheduled time for this, just two or three times a week, where I could spend an hour or more. The other days, I would read over what I had written down, which I could do quickly.

- time with other believers who became close friends. I learned a lot seeing their lives, sharing concerns, what God was teaching us, praying for each other, having fun together. I felt God's love through them and I learned a lot about God processing life with them.

- Bible study in someone's home or coffee shop...anywhere from 4 to 12 of us. (You can start a group, if you want, using this:

- conferences, church, books.

So, how do you find other believers?

You might already have a friend who has asked Jesus into his or her life. How would you know? Well, you could ask them.

You might also ask if there's a Bible study group or church they'd recommend.

There are many good ones. (There are some very weird ones out there also. Just to be honest.)

Ask God to guide you. He's able to caution you if a church or group doesn't seem right.

I'd like to offer you something else.

Having a relationship with God can be a wonderful experience. Or extremely frustrating.

There are land mines.

I remember the first year or so after asking Jesus into my life. I loved getting to know God. I'd spend hours in the Gospels, captivated by Jesus' life and how he interacted with people. The more I read, the more I appreciated him.

But I also found myself reading things in the Bible that took me off-guard. Certain actions were identified as *sins* that I had never viewed that way!

I also found commands like: "be patient, tenderhearted, forgiving," Those are far easier to read than to do.

In frustration, I thought, "It was much easier being an atheist."

Then, over the next several months, I started feeling like I owed God payback for all the great things he was doing in my life.

I thought, "Now that I know God is there, I should be talking to him more. I should be reading the Bible more. I should be talking to my friends who don't know him. I should be, I should be...."

Ok. Let me tell you -- that is NOT how God wants us to live out our relationship with him.

He has not asked us to open our arms, brace our footing, and catch some enormous, cosmic to-do list. He also is not asking us to prove that we are worthy to know him -- we're not! And he's perfectly ok with that.

God has an entirely different perspective on our relationship with him.

I'd love for you to grab this now. (I wish I had realized this

much sooner.) This is important. I put together for you a short, 6-part series I've simply called, "Skip the Stress."

Someone asked me:

"How do I tell someone about Jesus, without sounding like a psycho?"

I laughed for a while, because I loved how he worded that. That IS a great question, isn't it?

We want others to know God...to know his love, to be changed by his kindness and power, to have eternal life with God.

But, how do we do that?

Dr. Bill Bright was someone whose whole life was focused on helping others come to know Jesus. He used to say:

Our job is to simply tell others about Jesus, as we rely on the power of the Holy Spirit, and leave the results to God.

We don't convince anyone. God already wants a relationship with them.

So, what's our role?

I love this verse from the New Testament:

"And I pray that the sharing of your faith may promote the knowledge of all the good that is ours in Christ Jesus our Lord." (Philemon v6, rsv)

We get to share our faith in God. We get to tell people about all the *good* that comes from a relationship with Jesus.

How exactly do we go about that...again, without sounding like a psycho?!
